

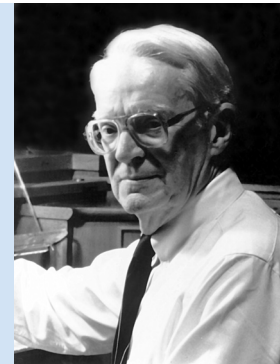
In Memoriam

Marguerite Thal

Marguerite Long Thal, BM '57, MM '58 (organ), died in December 2008. She was a longtime concert and church organist in the Ann Arbor area. She began her music studies in western Kansas where she was raised and went on to study organ with Marilyn Mason. After graduation, she received a Fulbright grant to study in Paris for two years where she attended the American University and studied with Jean Langlais and Nadia Boulanger. When she returned to the U.S., she moved to Toledo to accept a position as minister of music at First Congregational Church and taught organ at Bowling Green State University. During her lifetime, she took active roles in the local chapters of the American Guild of Organists, Sigma Alpha Iota, Monday Musicales, and the Toledo Modern Art Group. In 1990, she was commissioned minister of music at Sylvania United Church of Christ, where she served in that role for 18 years. In addition to church activities, she gave many solo performances throughout the area and also appeared with the Prinzipal VI, a group of six organists who performed regionally.

Marilyn Fosdick

Marilyn S. Fosdick, BM '45 (music theory), passed away November 13, 2008 at the St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor, surrounded by her loving family. A talented pianist and organist, she was an active member of the alumni chapter of Mu Phi Epsilon Musical Society for over 50 years. A lifelong Lutheran, she was a devoted and active member of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Ann Arbor for over 50 years where she directed the Young People's Choir for five years from 1956-1961. She was a representative of the church to Lutheran Social Services of Michigan and taught hymns to young mentally handicapped adults. Marilyn also volunteered for many years, providing music therapy to Veterans at the V.A. Hospital in Ann Arbor.
